
EnCorps (CTE) MENTORSHIP ALLIANCE




SUMMARY

Through the LAUSD CTE partnership, EnCorps supported thousands of students and teachers in building practical, career-ready skills while fostering creativity, confidence, and a deep sense of belonging in the classroom for students and teachers alike.

This program supported 24 first and second year CTE teachers across 21 different schools in Los Angeles using a mentor/mentee format. EnCorps provided pedagogical training and support throughout the school year and matched new teachers with a veteran teacher at their school for monthly check-ins, observations, and feedback. In total, this cohort served over 3,000 students participating in CTE courses such as Software and System Development, Fashion and Interior Design, and Health Science.

"Collaborating with my mentor supported my professional development by giving me a reliable source of feedback, encouragement, and practical strategies tailored to my classroom needs."




